






Chancellor Young's inaugural pledge was to advance UCLA "to the first rank of excellent universities."

The UCLA home locker room at the Rose Bowl Stadium will be dedicated to former UCLA Chancellor Dr. Charles Young (1968-1997), who was responsible for UCLA Football's move to the Rose Bowl Stadium in 1982 as its permanent home field.

During his tenure, Chancellor Young improved UCLA to a top-10 research university in the country, drastically increased student enrollment, doubled faculty and achieved the highest fundraising totals ever achieved by a UC campus. Nearing the completion of his leadership, Chancellor Young led a \$1.2B fundraising drive for UCLA, at the time the most ambitious ever attempted by a public university.

UCLA and the Rose Bowl would like to honor the legacy of Chancellor Young and his contributions to UCLA, Bruins Football and the future of the Rose Bowl - home stadium of the Bruins Football.
